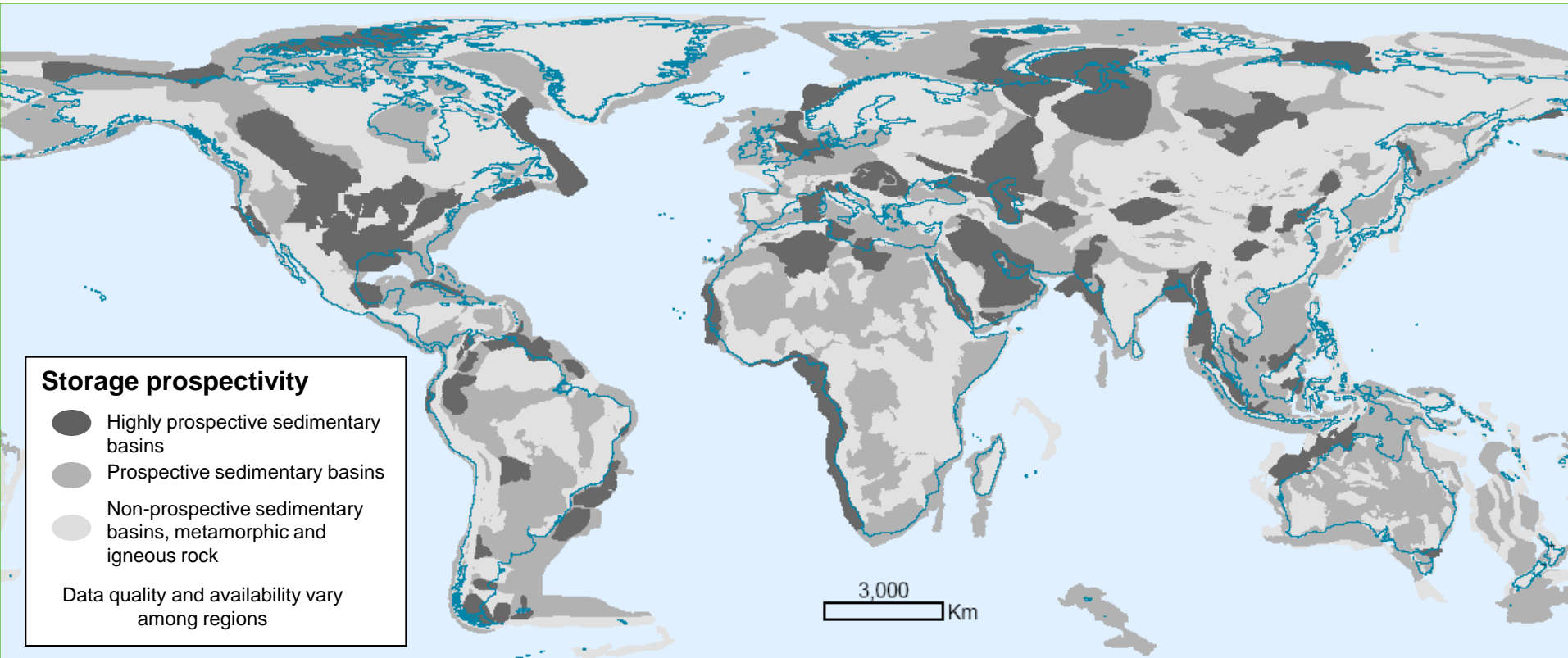
Three messages

A Copenhagen Agreed Outcome should include CCS but also offer something for countries for which CCS is not relevant

CCS-readiness: handle with care

CCS taking longer than initially thought

Plants built in the meantime?

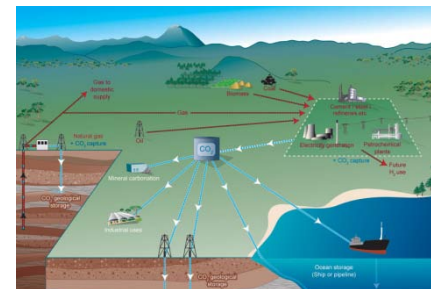
“CCS-readiness”

- Space and capture installation/process
- Transport and storage possibilities/guarantees
- Social site characterisation

Uncertainties

- Guarantees that CCS is eventually used?
- Future technology?
- Incentives/mandates/best practices?

Does CCS have to be through the demo phase before we can understand CCS-readiness?



Public perception may not be what you think

Take the perspective of a lay person

- Lack of understanding of the technology
- I wonder: why me?
- Worried about safety, the value of your property
- The experts do not make the impression that they understand my concerns
- Nobody is listening

Stop convincing, start involving

Public trust needs an independent expert community that improves, not promotes the technology
